

Columbia Gas Columbia Gas will be working with Miller Pipeline to upgrade the natural gas lines in the Village of Magnolia beginning February 2021 and completing the project by end of summer 2021. Snippets from our Magnolia Historical Society

Magnolia Village Hall on North Main Street was originally Magnolia School, built in 1896 on land donated by Augustus R. Elson. The first high school class of 1896 included Austin Boyd, Bert Farber, Margaret Farber, Albert Grubbs, and S.B. Weaver. Professor was A.H. Richardson. In 1931 a new school was opened on Harrison Street. The old building was used for many purposes over the years including Police headquarters, Village Council chambers, a historical society room, scout meeting rooms, a teen dance hall, and the Magnolia Post Office in the 1950's and 1960's.
